

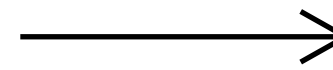
INSTRUCTIONS

Significant situations in relation to you patients
E.g. the admission, admission or discharge, conversations, documentation in the medical records, follow-up etc.

The Partnership

A Shared expertise
We use the patient's health as the collective responsibility of the patient and the professionals and we utilise each other's expertise.

B The Agreement
Together with patients we arrive at decisions about goals for the patient's health and how health and social care will function.

The Patient Narrative

C Experience and Perception
We have an understanding of the patient's experience and perception of their symptoms and their condition.

D See the person
We understand the patient's abilities, life situation, and challenges.

Documentation

E Shared documentation
Our documentation shall capture the patient narrative, health goals and the medical information in a way that both patient and professional understand.

F Health Plan
We clearly document the patient's agreed health goals and the tasks needed to get there. These are clearly and understandably documented in a health plan.

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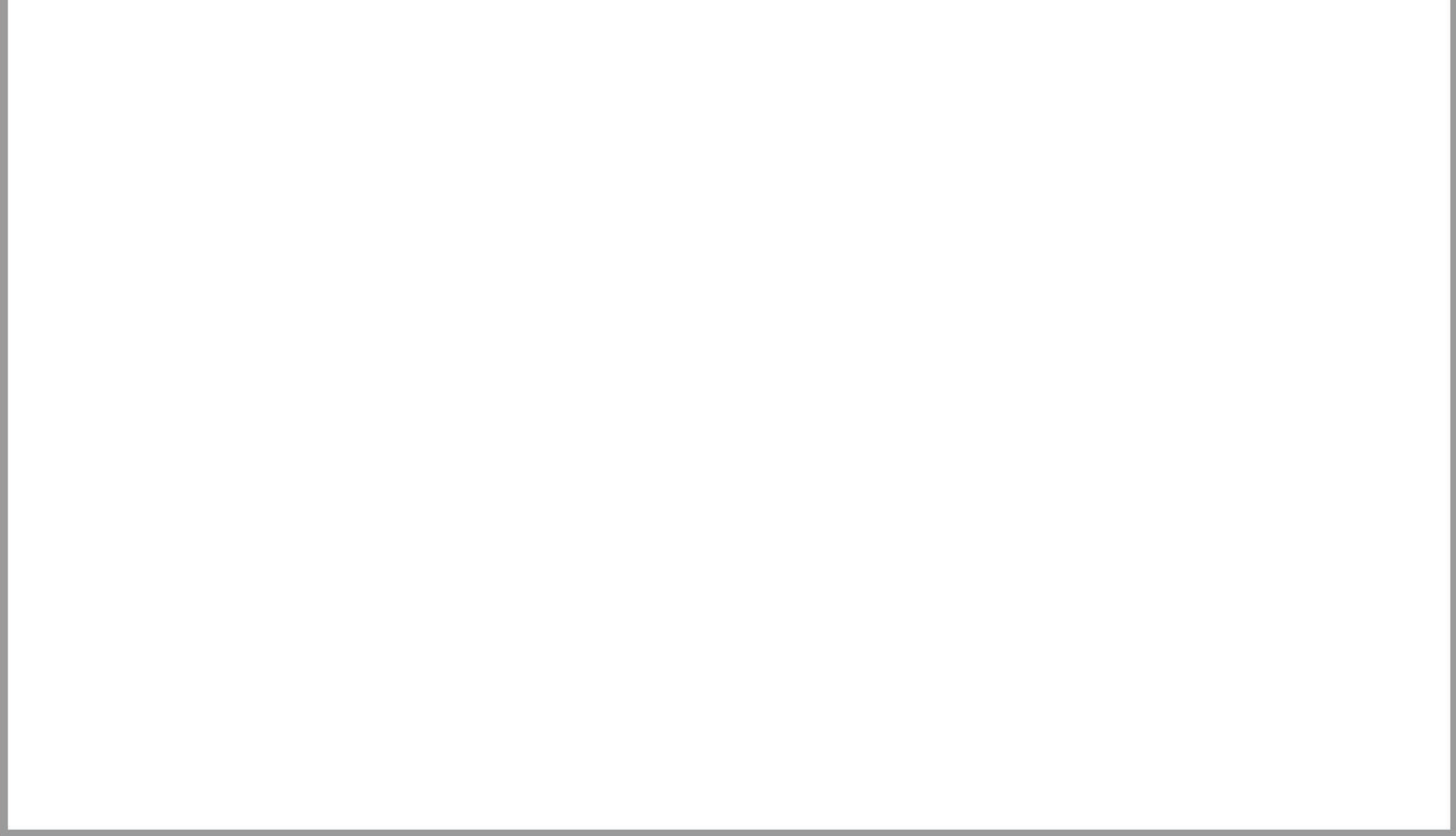
